

Permit Application Process for out-of-state rotators

The following are some new rules required **ONLY** for applicants doing rotations in Texas as part of the applicant's **out-of-state** training program. This letter must be signed by the Texas licensed physician (Program Directors) supervising Texas rotations here at UT and in our office once permission has been granted to the applicant so that we can get the letter the Board in a timely manner.

Letter to Texas Medical Board that certifies the following:

1. the facility at which the rotations are being completed
2. the dates the rotations will be completed in Texas
3. that the Texas on-site preceptor physician will supervise and be responsible for the applicant during the rotation in Texas
4. signature of the Program Director and department name

*Rotator permits are limited to the dates of the rotation in Texas. The permit will reflect the name and address of the out of state postgraduate training program, not the Texas program where the rotation is being completed.

This must be at the Board no later than 60 days before the program start date.
