Course Objective**Material Covered & Skills to be Acquired:**

To become familiar with the basic concepts of microbial-host interaction considering host (age, debility, immune deficiency, foreign body), and microbial factors (dose, virulence). The student must be able to prepare a differential diagnosis, develop a diagnostic approach and know the appropriate therapy for the patient with: meningitis, endocarditis, a pulmonary infiltrate, upper respiratory infection, "sepsis" urinary tract infection, pelvic infection, cellulitis, fever of unknown origin, syphilis, and gonorrhea.

To obtain a working knowledge of antimicrobial therapy as applied to office practice, hospitalized patients, and the compromised host.

To understand the processing of biological materials for culture including blood, urine, pus, cerebral spinal fluid, and sputum and to be able to identify common bacterial pathogens including group A Streptococcus, Streptococcus pneumoniae, Staphylococcus aureus, Hemophilus influenzae, Escherichia coli, Pseudomonas, Salmonella, and Shigella. To understand the value and limitations of anaerobic bacteriology and clinical virology.
