Course Objective

Material Covered:

- This elective is designed for students who have completed their required Family Medicine clerkship and Ambulatory selective and desire more exposure to ambulatory Family Medicine. The specific goals and objectives of the course will be the same as for the required third year clerkship and fourth year Family Medicine selective
- For students coming from another medical school who would like an exposure to Family Medicine in Houston, the goals and objectives of this clerkship may be either very similar to the third year Family Medicine clerkship or fourth year Family Medicine selective, depending on their level of experience.

Skills Acquired:

- The same skills will be acquired as those acquired during the third and fourth year Family Medicine clerkship/selective.
